NOBLIN
FUNERAL SERVICE



The building which is now Noblin Funeral Service was originally the First United Presbyterian Church of Belen.

The church had its beginning with the German Lutheran community in Belen. The congregation was incorporated as Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in 1885 and officially organized by the Synod of Nebraska in 1888.

The church first worshipped in an adobe house, then purchased an abandoned Congregational Church. The church built its first sanctuary, an adobe building on Main Street, in 1904. In 1911 the church built the current adobe sanctuary designed by an architect in Chicago. The original art glass windows were from a Chicago studio and most are memorials to the older local German families.

As time went by, the Lutherans invited other congregations to form a federated church, and the name was officially changed in 1948 to The Federated Church of Belen. The congregation then agreed to become part of the United Presbyterian Church in 1964.

With serious space problems as well as increased parking and traffic problems, the congregation voted to relocate and is now working towards building a new facility in Rio Communities on Manzano Expressway.

In 1997, the church was purchased and became a funeral home. In June of 2005, Robert C. Noblin, Jr., a licensed funeral director from Fredericksburg, Virginia purchased the business and is the current owner and manager of the funeral home, changing the name to Noblin Funeral Service in December 2010 to prepare for the opening of the Noblin Funeral Service, Los Lunas Chapel.

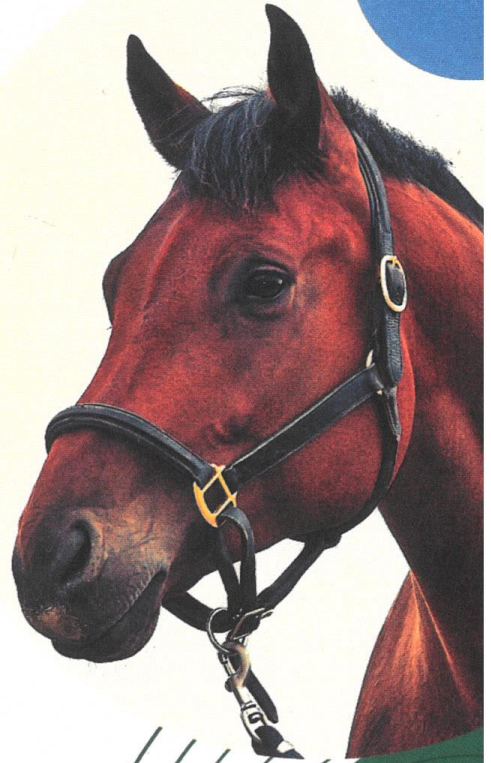

Immunizations Available

Belen, NM – The New Mexico Department of Health’s Belen Public Health Office at 617 Becker Ave, Belen, NM will be providing no cost back-to-school vaccinations for all children aged 18 and younger regardless of whether they are a patient or have insurance at the following dates and times:

- Tuesday, 8/1: 10 a.m-6 p.m.
- Wednesday, 8/2: 10 a.m-6 p.m.
- Thursday, 8/3: 10 a.m-6 p.m.
- Saturday, 8/12: 10 a.m.-2 p.m.

Call 505-864-7743 for more information or with any questions.

Parents need to bring their child’s shot record and Medicaid or private health insurance card if they have insurance, even though immunizations are provided at no cost to parents. No one will be turned away if they don’t have insurance.

To get a copy of your child’s vaccinations record if you don’t have one already, visit VaxViewNM.org to download a copy or call 1-833-882-6454. Customers may also leave a voicemail and receive a call back. Immunization program hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. M-F, closed 12 to 1 p.m. for lunch.

The vaccinations are available through the Got Shots? immunization campaign organized by the New Mexico Immunization Coalition, which includes the New Mexico Primary Care Association and the Department of Health. This year, 78 community health centers, public health offices, and private practices across New Mexico are participating in Got Shots?. To find a clinic in local communities statewide, people are encouraged to go online to immunization.doh.nm.gov and click on the “Got Shots? Information” link.

Valencia County Juvenile Justice Grant. Youth Sub-Committee members assist in dissemination of program resources to community partners through attendance at community events and youth lead activities.

Grant Goal:

To improve the Juvenile Justice System and decrease the incidences of juvenile delinquency in the community while increasing the emphasis on prevention and early intervention in juvenile justice services.

Botvin LifeSkills- is an evidence-based Life Skills Training (LST). The goals of LST are to prevent tobacco, alcohol, and illicit drug use by targeting key risk and protective factors associated with these behaviors. LST has five key components: cognitive, self-improvement, decision-making, coping with anxiety, and social skills training. Contact Heather at vegirlscircle@gmail.com

Girls Circle-contains gender specific topics to target body image, healthy relationships, safe sex, and accepting diversity. This program targets pre-teen and adolescent girls and young women of all races and ethnicities, and LGBTQ youth who identify with female adolescent development 9 to 18 years, regardless of risk level. Boys Council- The Council targets youth of all races and ethnicities displaying aggressive/violent behavior, marginalized youth having negative contact with the system, and those with negative peer relationships. This program targets pre-teens and adolescent boys and young men and LGBTQ youth who identify with male adolescent development 9 to 18 years, regardless of risk level. Restorative Justice-Restorative justice is a theory of justice that focuses on mediation and agreement rather than punishment. Offenders must accept responsibility for harm and make restitution with victims. Contact Noelle at noellecerw@gmail.com

Reception Assessment Center-RAC is a detention diversion program that provides an alternative to incarceration for law enforcement and school officials who detain youth who have committed low level or non-detainable offenses. By interrupting their involvement into the juvenile justice system, this approach sets a positive trajectory for the youth and their families. *The goal is to intervene swiftly and connect youth and their family to community resources to prevent further involvement with the juvenile justice system.* Contact Jenna at h2racsupervisor@gmail.com
